


The number of diocesan priests available are declining.

Recommendations for Family #21

- 1. Projected number of active priests for this family by 2030 = 1
- 2. Based upon scoring and metrics, it is recommended that the family rightsize and reshape this family evaluating the following recommendations:
 - a. Continue the merger of St. Lawrence parish with Blessed Trinity with the sale of the St. Lawrence property.
 - SS. Columba Brigid Parish is recommended to merge with St. Stanislaus.
 - c. An evaluation of necessary property. The Family Promise program at SS. Columba Brigid needs to be considered in this decision.
 - d. Hispanic ministry will move to St. Stanislaus with a Spanish Mass being offered on Sundays.
 - e. Monitor Blessed Trinity and St. Martin de Porres on a yearly basis to determine viability.

<u>Justification</u>

- 1. The St. Lawrence merger is already underway.
- 2. SS. Columba Brigid location to St. Stanislaus is 1.1 miles.
- 3. Strategic decision to bring communities together because of their location and allow SS. Columba Brigid to expand ministry of St. Stanislaus.
- Monitoring of the other two parishes in this family on a yearly basis will be essential so that at the first sign of non-viability the situation can be addressed.
